## 20th Sunday

The psalm this weekend gives us a great image of how God comes to our rescue. It says that God has pulled us from the pit, from the muddy swamp, and has placed us back on rock, on firm footing. Sometimes we do find ourselves in a spiritual or psychological pit with no way out. At a desperate hour, when we've almost lost hope, Christ reaches down and pulls us out.

In the summers growing up, we used to go to the little river in the neighborhood. Once I remember walking into some quick sand and was almost up to my waist in sand. I was stuck. I could not get out on my own. Luckily my siblings were nice enough to pull me out. This is what Our Lord does for us, He pulls us out of situations we might find ourselves stuck in.

These times are very humbling for us because there is nothing we can do on our own. We need the help of others, and the help of Christ to get us out. We ultimately cannot do the Christian thing on our own, nor were we made to. We need Christ and His grace before we even start. We can do nothing separate from Him. We cannot love God without His grace. We cannot love others without His grace. We cannot avoid sin and be virtuous without His grace.

As the psalm begins, we have to wait on the Lord—we have to vigilantly and patiently wait. This waiting implies preparation for the coming of the Lord. This waiting does not mean we become idle, nor does it mean we become preoccupied with other things to pass the time. Jesus should be the first thing on our mind when we wake up in the morning, and the last thing on our mind when we go to bed. May we wait with more patience and vigilance, so that He will find us alert when He comes.

### The August 2016, Respect Life Focus Topic - Capital Punishment/Mercy behind Bars

#### A Prayer for Justice with Mercy on Death Row by Kathie Uhler, OSF

O God, I pray for all the persons who have been sentenced to death row in our country.

Each one bears a sacred dignity, I believe, although my own sinfulness dulls my ability to see this underlying beauty.

I pray, then, for an end to the death sentence itself. Let justice be served where there is clear guilt, but let recompense come from the examples of your own mercy:

- When you did not execute but exiled Cain (Genesis 4: 1-15).
- When you said you took no pleasure in the death of the wicked but in their conversion (Ezekiel33:11).
- When you told us you delight in showing clemency and will tread underfoot our guilt and throw all our sins into the depths of the sea (Micah 7: 18-19).

My God, I pray to you each day for largeness of heart and mercy in the words of Jesus: "Father, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who have trespassed against us" (Matthew 6: 9-13). Amen.

## Eucharistic Boat Procession

**Come let us adore Him! Fête-Dieu du Teche**, a Eucharistic Boat Procession down Bayou Teche, will take place on the Feast of the Assumption, Monday, August 15, 2016. All are invited to a Mass in French at 8:00 AM at St. Leo the Great in Leonville to begin the day.

Bishop Douglas Deshotel will preside and give the homily. At the end of Mass, there will be a procession from Church with the Blessed Sacrament to the boat landing. At 9:30 AM, 50 boats will disembark in procession and make their way down Bayou Teche, retracing part of the actual journey of our Acadian ancestors, toward St. Martinville. The boat procession will stop at each Church along the way for recitation of the rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament (10:20 AM – 11:05 AM in Arnaudville; 11:45 AM – 12:30 PM in Cecilia; 1:35 PM – 2:20 PM in Breaux Bridge; 3:15 PM – 4:00 PM in Parks). The procession will arrive in St. Martinville at about 4:45 PM and disembark behind Notre Dame de Perpetuel Secours and enter the Church for Benediction. The procession will continue on foot to St. Martin de Tours for the 5:15 PM Benediction and then down main street to Mater Dolorosa Chapel for Solemn Vespers and Final Benediction at 6:00 PM. Confessions will be heard at each of the stops along the way, including before Mass in Leonville and at Mater Dolorosa from 5:00 PM- 6:00 PM.
