27th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Our second reading this Sunday is taken from St. Paul's Second Letter to St. Timothy. Timothy was a pupil of St. Paul's and a young bishop. St. Paul wrote two letters to St. Timothy to teach him how to be a good bishop for his people, and to also encourage him in his youth. We see a biblical defense for Holy Orders here when St. Paul says, "Stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands." Imposition of hands is an important liturgical gesture, and we see it here in the New Testament.

What is imposition of hands? Imposition of hands is when an ordained minister places or imposes his hands over a person or thing. Using Mass as an example we better understand its symbolism. At every Mass, during the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest places his hands over the bread and wine, and the bells are usually rung here briefly as well. The words the priest says at this moment invokes the Holy Spirit. So imposition of hands symbolizes what is spiritually happening, the Holy Spirit is coming down. In the second verse of the first chapter of Genesis we see the Spirit of God hovering over the waters of the abyss.

We see the imposition of hands at some moment in all the other sacraments, particularly in Holy Orders. In my honest opinion, the most powerful moment in ordination liturgies is when those to be ordained kneel before the bishop as he places his hands on them. This is imposition of hands par excellence, and is precisely what St. Paul is referring to when he says St. Timothy has received the Holy Spirit through him. Every priest and deacon who is ordained receives the Holy Spirit through the bishop by the imposition of hands. There is a visible sign to every sacrament. For instance, the visible sign of the Eucharist is bread and wine. Part of the visible sign of the sacrament of Holy Orders is the imposition of hands. So priests have received imposition of hands to carry out the duties and responsibilities that come with being a priest.

Not just priests, but all of us have sacramentally received the Holy Spirit. At our baptism we receive the Holy Spirit. The minister even raises his hands over the candidate prior to baptism. During Confirmation liturgies the bishop raises his hands over the confirmandi. Married couples as well have an imposition of hands during the nuptial blessing that is given right after the Our Father is said.

The Holy Spirit is given to us so that we might live up to the dignity that we have sacramentally received during these moments, i.e. baptism, confirmation, marriage. During Confirmation we promise publicly and on our own to follow Christ and live out our faith each day. At marriage we become joined to another on our road to heaven. Let us call upon the Holy Spirit everyday to stir into flame the gifts He has given us and that we may live up to the life that we have promised.


